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## Three-in-One

This week, Christian churches have been celebrating Trinity Sunday. The Trinity is often described as a 'mystery'; the idea of one God, but made up of three persons – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Our school logo has three parts to it, and this can help us to remember the Trinity. The three parts are intertwined, linked together to create the whole. Some people see a crown when they look at our logo; others see three people holding hands.



The school logo also helps us to remember that we are a community school which has three, clear community aspects. We are a learning community, a community based on Christian values, and a local community.

### Counting everyday objects
